What is Group-Retro? Group Retro-

spective-Rating is a voluntary based incentive program that offers an alternative to the traditional Group-Experience-Rating. Employers enrolled in Group-Retro pay their full State Fund premiums and have an opportunity to receive retrospective premium adjustments tied to the performance of the group. Groups are made up of employers who share similar industry.

Depending on the performance of the group, employers could either receive a refund or potentially be assessed for additional premium. This program incentivizes employers to manage their safety and risk management well so the group can perform at a high level and maximize returns.

The groups are reviewed over three years following the policy year with the refund and/or assessments being cumulative.
