The Ohio Supreme Court: Clarifies Voluntary Abandonment

The Ohio Supreme Court issued a ruling favorable to Ohio employers of all shapes and sizes. In the case of State ex rel. Klein v. Precision Excavating & Grading Co, et al. (slip opinion 2018 Ohio 3890):

The Court held that when a claimant voluntarily removes him/herself from his/her former position of employment for reasons unrelated to a workplace injury, the claimant is no longer eligible for temporary total disability compensation even if the claimant remains disabled at the time of the separation of employment.
