NATIONAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH – October

HISTORY

Domestic Violence Awareness Month evolved from the “Day of Unity” held in October 1981 and conceived by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence. The “Day of Unity” soon evolved into a week, and in October of 1987, the first National Domestic Violence Awareness Month was observed. In 1989 Congress passed Public Law 101-112, officially designating October of that year as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Such legislation has been passed each year since.

As the 2018 General Election quickly approaches, it is important that Ohioans have all the information they need to be engaged and active voters. To participate in the November 6 General Election, you must be a registered voter. If you are not yet registered, you can do so in a matter of minutes by visiting www.MyOhioVote.com. Online voter registration is both fast and easy, and you have until October 9 to get registered. Absentee voting begins on October 10, which gives voters two convenient ways to cast a ballot.

For additional information, voters can access an online voter toolkit at www.MyOhioVote.com to make sure they're prepared to participate in the general election. Those visiting the website will be able to check their registration, view a sample ballot, request an absentee ballot, access the early voting schedule, and find their Election Day polling place.

Early Voting in Ohio started Thursday, October 11, 2018. Montgomery County's Board of Election will be open to voters from 8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m. Monday-Friday until last voting Friday, November 2, 2018.
