This is Black History Month and below are some facts you may not know:

- 1. The first celebration of Black History Month took place in February 1970, Within six years it was recognized nationally.
- 2. Phillis Wheatley was only 12 when she became the first female African American author published in 1773.
- 3. In 1939 Hattie McDaniel was the first African American to win Best Supporting Actress. However, she wasn't allowed to attend the Gone With Wind's National Premiere.
- 4. Josephine Baker was a spy for the French during WWII.
- 5. The law prohibiting interracial marriages in the U.S. was overturned in 1967.
- 6. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated on Maya Angelou's 40th birthday.
- 7. Rosa Parks was not the first to give up her seat on a public bus. On March 2, 1955, Claudette Colvin 15 years old, refused to give up her seat, this was nine months prior to Rosa Parks 'arrest.
- 8. Matthew Henson was a key member of the first successful expedition to the North Pole.
- 9. Madam C. J. Walker, an entrepreneur, became the first black female self-made millionaire.
- 10. Octavia E. Butler was dyslexic, became a science fiction writer.
- 11. Benjamin Banneker taught himself astronomy and math to become American's first known African American Man of Science.

Who Needs Workers' Compensation

By Ohio law, employers with one or more employees must have workers' compensation coverage and those with coverage must keep their policy information updated.

For example, you will need to contact BWC to begin a policy or update information if you are:

- Starting a new business.
- Working as an independent contractor or subcontractor and you have employees.
- Acquiring, merging, purchasing and/or selling a business.
- Updating your existing workers' compensation policy.

How does an employer obtain Workers Compensation?

In Ohio, all employers with one or more employees must, by law, have workers' compensation coverage. Coverage for Ohio employers and their employees becomes effective when BWC receives a complet-

ed Application for Ohio Workers' Compensation Coverage (U-3) and the \$120 minimum, non-refundable application fee.

Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 4167

OAC 4167 was amended during the 2018 Five-Year Rule Review (5YRR). OAC 4167 was amended during the 2018 Five-Year Rule Review (5YRR). 5YRR amendments include changes to:

- 4167-6-10 Reporting fatalities, hospitalization, amputations, and loss of an eye as a result of work related incidents.
- 4167-8-01 Inspection procedures. Effective date 01/01/2019.

Who Is OSHA? Who Is PERRP?

- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- Public Employment Risk Reduction Program
- Both agencies are responsible for worker safety and health protection.

Public employers must report (to PERRP) the following incidents within twenty-four hours:

- 1. The hospitalization of one or more employees;
- 2. An employee amputation; or
- 3. An employee's loss of an eye.
