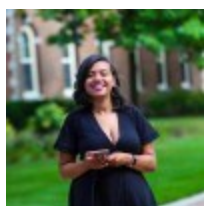

BBB Scam Alert: Employment scams target college students

Many college students are looking for flexible, part-time employment to help cover school expenses. Finding a job can be difficult, and students feel pressure to find work quickly. If this situation describes you or a student in your life, watch out for scams. BBB Scam Tracker has gotten reports of employment scams impersonating professors and university departments. she was likely the victim of a job scam.

How the scam works

You receive an email to your school email address encouraging you to apply for a job. The message appears to come from your school's job placement office, student services department, or even a specific professor. When you reply to the message, things start to get strange. The "employer" hires you without an interview. Then, they send you a check with instructions to deposit it before you've even done any work. You are

instructed to use this money to purchase gift cards, money orders, prepaid debit cards, or other supplies you'll need for your new job. Part of what you purchase should be sent to your new employer. The rest of the money will be your payment.

However, the check is a fake. Any money you sent to your "employer" is gone for good. In addition, the scammers now have your personal information.

How to avoid employment scams

- **Do your research.** Before you say yes to any job, research the company that wants to hire you. Does the company have a professional website and legitimate contact information? Search for what others are saying about their experience with this company.

- **Beware of red flags.** Scammers often send emails with many typos and grammatical errors. They offer to hire you without an interview and even pay you before you've done any work. None of these are behaviors of a reputable business.

Never send money to strangers. Never send funds in the form of cash, checks, gift cards or wire transfers to someone you don't know or haven't met. No legitimate company will ask you to pay them to get a job.

OSHA ALERT

Prevent Heat Illness at Work

Outdoor and **indoor** heat exposure can be dangerous.

Nearly 3 out of 4 heat illness fatalities happen during the first week of work. New and returning workers need to build tolerance to heat by taking frequent breaks and working shorter shifts in the heat to start.

Dangerous heat exposure can occur indoors or outdoors, in any season. Employers can keep workers safe by following these simple safety practices:

1. Follow the 20% Rule — on the 1st day, don't allow employees to work more than 20% of a shift at full intensity in the heat. Increase their time by no more than 20% a day until they are used to working in the heat.
2. Provide cool drinking water — encourage workers to drink at least one cup every 20 minutes, even if they are not thirsty.
3. Rest breaks — allow workers time to recover from heat in a shady or cool location.
4. Dress for the heat — have workers wear a hat and light-colored, loose-fitting, breathable clothing if possible.
5. Watch out for each other — encourage workers to monitor themselves and others for signs of heat illness.
6. Look for any signs of heat illness, including fainting, dizziness, nausea, and muscle spasms, and act quickly — when in doubt, call 911.
7. Offer training on the hazards of heat exposure and how to prevent illness.
8. Develop an Emergency Action Plan on what to do if a worker shows signs of heat-related illness.
