# Do You Really Need Workers' Comp? Here's How to Know

If your business has **one or more employees**, you are required to carry workers' compensation coverage—even if those employees are corporate officers or family members.

Coverage is also required for **domestic workers** (like babysitters, housekeepers, or lawn-care workers) who earn \$160 or more in any 13-week period.

# You'll need coverage for:

- Full-time, part-time, and seasonal employees
- Employees working in Ohio (even if hired elsewhere)
- Out-of-state employees working in Ohio for more than 90 days
- Foreign workers performing any work in Ohio
- Emergency service volunteers (minimum reporting of \$300 per person annually) Spot or casual labor

Coverage is **optional** for sole proprietors, partners, ministers, and officers of family farm corporations—but they must complete an **Application for Elective Coverage (U-3S)** if they choose to opt in.
